THE KING'S TRUST CANADA

Launched in Canada in 2011 by His Majesty King Charles III, The King's Trust Canada joined The King's Trust Group in 2018. We are part of a global network of charities committed to working for young people, by empowering them to build the skills for a brighter future. The worldwide King's Trust network is deeply established in the communities it serves, driving a long-lasting impact that has stood the test of time.

With the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as our guide, and the vision of His Majesty The King as our inspiration, we invest in young people across Canada to help prepare them for and contribute to a better future.

Together with our growing community of partners, we continue to work to create social, economic, and environmental resilience through our youth employment programs.



The King's Trust Canada's head office is located on the traditional territory of the Haudenosaunee Confederacy, the Wendat First Nation, and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation, who are part of the Anishinaabe Nation. We are committed to acting in support of the recommendations outlined by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, and in support of the healing and reconciliation so necessary for our country to become stronger and more inclusive for future generations.

IMPACT IN 2023/24: BREAKING DOWN BARRIERS TO EMPLOYMENT FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

In 2023/24, the addition of new team members to our youth programming team set the stage for significant future growth of initiatives that strive to help young people build the skills, knowledge, and experience they need to secure jobs and establish meaningful careers.



Supporting young people to get work-ready

To address the skills gap impacting young people and employers alike, we offered 45 programs throughout the year to help young people build the job readiness and transferable skills they need to succeed in today's labour market. These programs focused on key skills like job search strategies, resume and cover letter writing, interview preparation, conflict resolution, effective communications, personal branding, stress management, and more.

Opening doors to career exploration

Young people need to know what careers are available to them before they can find a path best suited to their unique skills and interests. To address this gap, we offered 12 engaging career panels throughout the year featuring industry experts and professionals representing a wide range of sectors, from technology to sustainable tourism, carpentry to entrepreneurship and beyond. These panels allowed youth to get a close-up look into specific areas of work, find out what "a day in the life" looks like for different types of jobs, hear personal insights and lessons learned directly from sector leaders, and learn about how to further explore specific career paths.

Empowering young women to lead the future of tech

2022 brought the launch of The King's Trust Canada's Young Women in Tech program series sponsored by KPMG, which aims to empower young women with the digital skills they need to confidently lead us into the future of tech.

In our current iteration of the program series, we delivered programs spotlighting specific careers and skills in computer science, digital marketing, artificial intelligence, and search engine marketing. As part of this series, we worked with industry experts as well as KPMG volunteers, who shared their career experiences, insights, and knowledge. We are thrilled that more are signing up to volunteer for future programs.

Youth networking event brings young people together to build skills and make connections

Networking is a necessary skill in today's job market, so in March 2024, we brought together 100 young people from varied backgrounds to learn about the power of networks. The event featured interactive activity stations designed to help young people build confidence and practice their networking skills in an accessible, fun, and welcoming environment.

IMPACT IN 2023/24: THE POWER OF PARTNERSHIPS

We believe true change is only possible when we work together to make a difference. In 2023/24, we were proud to collaborate with a diverse group of partners — including those featured here.

Discover+: Connecting barriered youth with well-paying jobs

We're not just preparing young people for jobs; we're helping them land jobs too. Through our Discover+ program, we worked with employer partners — including Marriott Hotels of Canada, the Toronto Zoo, and the CN Tower — to help young people learn about different career paths and secure an entry level role.

Over the course of several days, each employer partner offered engaging behind-the-scenes access to their workplace, teams, and facilities. Meanwhile, participants received direct support from The King's Trust Canada team and community-based partners like JVS Toronto to develop specific skills, complete job applications, and prepare for guaranteed interviews with employer partners. We are thrilled to share that more than half of all young people who participated in our Discover+ programs were hired by employer partners in 2023/24!



Working with the 30 Birds Foundation to empower young women refugees from Afghanistan

In 2023, we partnered with the 30 Birds Foundation a grassroots charity dedicated to safeguarding the future of a group of 450 Afghan refugees, predominantly schoolgirls, who were evacuated in the wake of the Taliban takeover — to deliver three virtual workshops focused on career support and guidance, reaching over 50 young people. With a shared goal to help these young women thrive in their new lives, we will continue supporting the 30 Birds Foundation in the months ahead as it establishes an online platform to help those they serve stay connected and access the resources they need to take their next steps toward employment and long-term stability. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to participate in this rich program filled with good vibes. It was both a learning, sharing, and integration opportunity for me, having newly settled in Canada.

Working with the Mi'kmaw Native Friendship Centre to break down barriers to work readiness for urban Indigenous people

The Mi'kmaw Native Friendship Centre is a non-profit organization with a mission to provide structured, social-based programming for urban Indigenous people in Canada. Last year, our team delivered two work-readiness workshops for residents living in one of their newest housing developments in Halifax, with a focus on job search strategies, resumes, and cover letters. Participants engaged enthusiastically with the workshops, asking a variety of questions and expressing eagerness to implement the strategies they learned.



Delivering job search strategy workshops with Onyx Initiative

A new partner of The King's Trust Canada, the Onyx Initiative is a catalyst for the professional growth and development of young Black Canadians. In 2023, the organization began sharing information about our programs with their network of young participants and recently invited our team to deliver monthly job search strategy workshops through their online platform. We also delivered a mental well-being and stress management workshop specific to scholars still in college or university or those who have recently graduated, reaching almost 50 young people. We look forward to continuing to work with Onyx to deliver more programs and workshops for their highly engaged community of young people in the months and years ahead.

Engaging young people in partnership with the Ismaili Council of Canada

In the fall of 2023, The King's Trust Canada was proud to partner with the Ismaili Council of Canada on two major events. In September, our two organizations co-hosted "Global Ismaili Civic Day: Take Action for a Sustainable Future." Taking place simultaneously in Toronto, Ontario and Burnaby, British Columbia, this unique event featured a morning of education and discussion featuring Jonathan Arnold, Director of Clean Growth at the Canadian Climate Institute; Bo Aganaba, Founder and Principal at Good Being Co.; and Bodhi Patil, an ocean-climate solutionist. In the afternoon, participants engaged in environmental stewardship activities in both cities.

In November, we organized a special career-focused panel session at the Council's Illume Visual Arts and Film Festival. Called "Break into the Arts", the panel session — which was attended by almost 100 young festival goers — featured a diverse panel of leading industry experts who shared their personal pathways to success, insights, and guidance for the next generation of artists. The panelists included Patrick Rogers, CEO of Music Canada; Marguerite Pigott, Film Commissioner & Director of Entertainment Industries for the City of Toronto; and Menon Dwarka, Senior Vice President of Arts Consulting Group.



Delivering skills workshops with Say Somaali

In early 2024, we launched a new partnership with Say Somaali, a Black youth-led organization in Toronto that aims to increase the number of successful and self-fulfilled Somali youth. We have already delivered one workshop for 40 Somali youth and a community working session with 15 young professionals. We look forward to continuing to work with Say Somaali to deliver workshops and support their roll-out of new programming for the young people they serve in the months ahead.



IMPACT IN 2023/24: HELPING VETERANS THRIVE

In 2023/24, we continued to offer a wide range of support and resources to help former military members transition into civilian life, find their new identity, and discover new opportunities to serve.



Our program offerings included workshops that help Veterans explore the possibilities of entrepreneurship, boot camps delivered in partnership with academic institutions, meaningful mentorship opportunities, and more.

With The King's Trust Canada now focusing exclusively on tackling the youth employment crisis, our programming for Veterans came to an end at the close of the 2023/24 fiscal year. We have and will continue to successfully transition Veterans to other organizations who are able to serve them.



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
